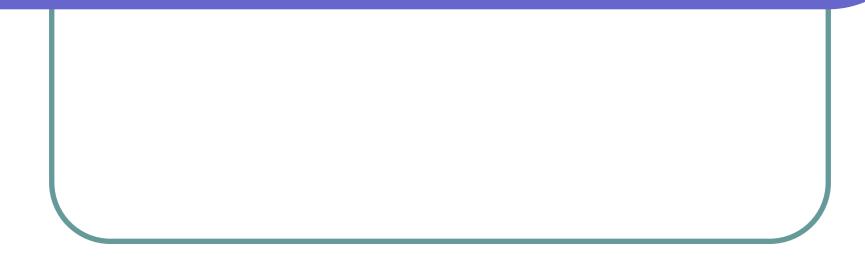
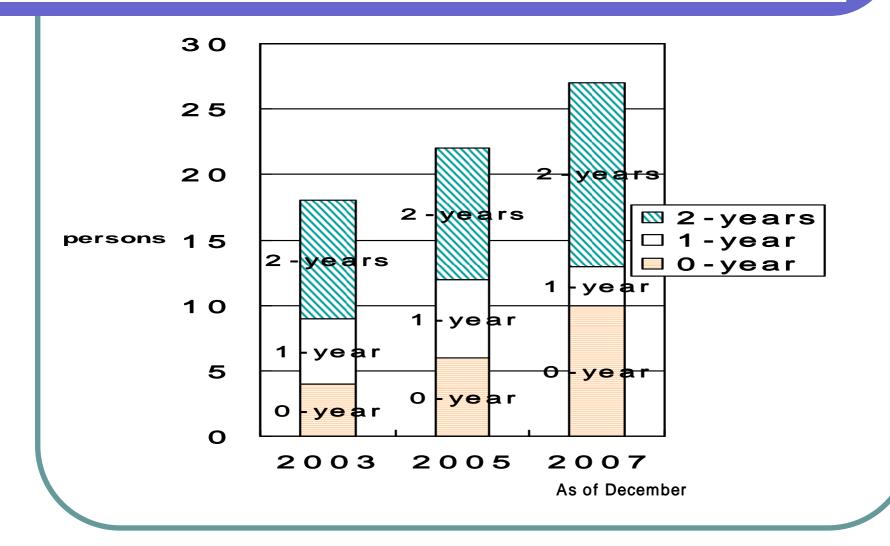
## Assistance Program after Early Detection of Hearing Impairment

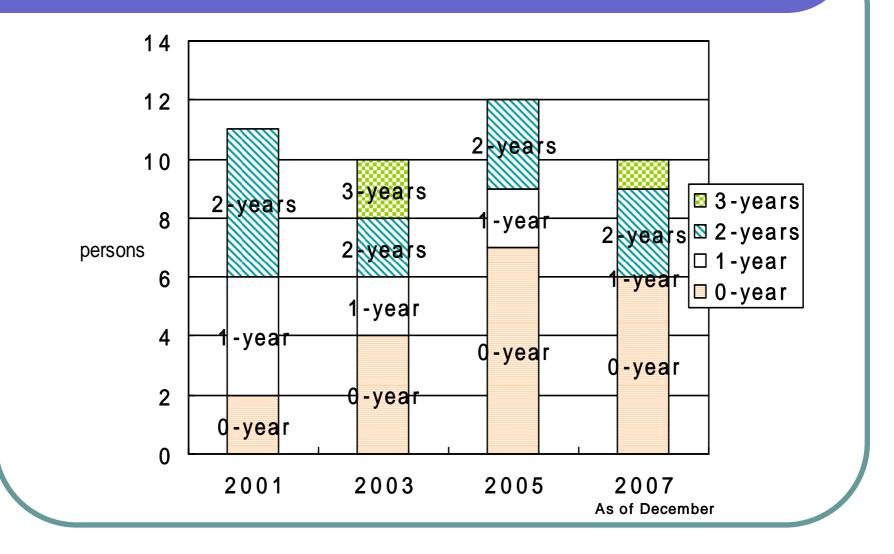


Parent Infant Program in Asahikawa School for the Deaf

### Approach of research study

### (1)Case example of parental assistance at initial counseling

- 6 cases with different backgrounds such as an age diagnosed as hearing impairment and process to receive a guidance
- Assistance progress of initial counseling, after 3months, and after 6-months

(Condition, problems, needs of parents and concrete assistance program for them)

#### < Profile >

- ·0 year old, Male
- Sensorineural hearing loss
- ·Binaural non-response to ABR

< At initial counseling (at the age of 4-months) > Conditions of the parent

- Psychologically agitated
- Explained from the doctor as follows;
  - "He won't hear a sound with hearing aids on. Cochlear implant is recommended."
- Assuming that their infant cannot hear anything
- According to Internet or books, they sometimes think positive and negative.

< At initial counseling (at the age of 4-months) > Needs from the parent

- (A) Reduction of the parent's shock and anxiety
- (B) Sorting information which the parent has
- (C) Perspective of developmental education
- (D) Overall assistance in the community

## < At initial counseling: at the age of 4-months > Assistance program

- (A) Listening to the parent with empathy toward their anxiety and shocks.
- (B) Explaining about characteristics of ABR, the result of COR, and the outline of cochlear implant. Recommending to wear hearing aids.
- (C) Explaining about outline of P.I.P assistance and program at kindergarten department.
- (D) Contacting with a nurse at local health institution to tell the necessity of the community support for the mother.

#### < After 3-months: at the age of 7-months > Conditions of the parent

- Feeling that their infant didn't demand as much care as his sister.
- Feeling puzzled about their infant detaching hearing aids at home.
- Finding it not obviously effective to wear hearing aids.
- (Mother) Not accepting an offer to join a parenting circle suggested by a health nurse.
  - When applying for "identification booklet for the handicapped", suspicious about the diagnostic outcome, but not telling about it to the doctor in charge.

## < After 3-months: at the age of 7-months > Needs from the parent

- (A) Assistance for hearing aids and for observing auditory response.
- (B) Purchase application for hearing aids.
- (C) How to enjoy playing with their infant with empathy.
- (D) Setting up the opportunity to exchange among parents.
- (E) Links to medical/health institutions.

## < After 3-months: at the age of 7-months > Programs of assistance

- (A) Advising the parent to have enjoyable experiences when their infant putting hearing aids on. Explaining about his response to sound, changes in phonation, recognizable life sound, and know-how of sound play.
- (B) Asking the department of welfare of city government to give an explanation to the parent.

## < After 3-months: at the age of 7-months > Programs of assistance

- C) Explaining about their sympathy and feelings toward their infant could increase his expressions as well as their infant having started to show various expressions even just slightly.
- Advising the parent to join an event for the 0year olds.
- E) Visiting the local pediatrics and otolaryngology to exchange information about further assistance for them.

# < After 6-months: at the age of 10-months > Conditions of the parent

- Having started to realize that their infant was not always unable to hear a sound, since their infant came to wear hearing aids for some 10 minutes a couple of times a day.
- Having started to write comments that they have enjoyable communication in their child-care diary.

**Tendency of parental feelings** 

Seen in 6 study cases;

About changes of parental feelings according to when impairment detected as follows;

- Right after giving assistance
- 6-months after giving assistance

Psychological tendency of parents seen in case studies Case 1: Impairment detected through screening

- (Mother) Suffering from psychological anxiety after delivery.
- Puzzled without appropriate assistance after having the result "refer."
- Assuming that their infant cannot hear anything, so they have less relationship with him/her.
- Not recognizing that their infant is hearingimpaired. (in case of moderate hearing level.)
- Losing their interest in other development than sense of hearing.

Psychological tendency of parents seen in case studies Case 1: Impairment detected through screening



- Anxiety of parents being eased by knowing the condition of their infant's impairment.
- Starting to look not only to auditory sense but to overall development of their infant.
- Able to grow their attachment for their infant by realizing his/her growth and good aspects.

Psychological tendency of parents seen in case studies Case 2: Impairment detected at the age of 1

- Not pessimistic about hearing impairment in case of parents' having an infant with other disorder.
- Feeling some difficulty in communicating with their infant, but not worrying seriously about relationship with him/her.

Psychological tendency of parents seen in case studies Case 2: Impairment detected at the age of 1



- Seeing clear about matters to consider.
- Starting to look at their infant's facial expression carefully, since parents find it important to accept his/her variety of expressions.

Psychological tendency of parents seen in case studies Case 3: Impairment detected at the age of 2

- Regretting delay of impairment detection.
- Recognizing difficulties of daily communication with their infant.
- Giving up trying to communicate with their infant, since they think that he/she cannot understand what they say.
- A tension seen in parent-child relationship.
- Puzzled how to discipline and communicate with their infant.

Psychological tendency of parents seen in case studies Case 3: Impairment detected at the age of 2

## 6-months after giving assistance

- Understanding enjoyment and necessity of communication with their infant.
- Anxiously wanting their infant to speak.
- Tending to drill language into their infant.
- Urged to make a decision to go to next educational / developmental-education institution.

Psychological tendency of parents seen in case studies Common tendencies

- Having unstable psychological condition due to anxiety of their infant's future as well as a great shock after knowing a diagnosis.
- Blaming themselves, and/or trying to find out causes of their infant's impairment.
- Discontented with a treatment, in spite of being explained about diagnosis outcome at a medical institute.
- Not able to grasp the conditions of their infant, since information which parents collect is often biased.

Psychological tendency of parents seen in case studies Common tendencies

### 6-months after giving assistance

- Starting talking about the relationship with their infant and family concerns.
- Feeling mentally stable, since they have a place to sympathize among other parents.
- Starting to find both good aspects and problems of their infant through group activities.
- Feeling discontent to their family when they cannot get the understandings about hearing impairment within the family.

Parental feelings after their infant's wearing hearing aids Case 1: Impairment detected through screening

- Feel sorry about their infant with hearing aids on.
- Both parents and infants feeling stressful with troubles about hearing aids such as detaching, chewing, and breaking.
- Finding it hard to find wear-effect, since it is not clear as well as reproducible.
- Confirming wear-effect by enjoying playing with their infant.

Parental feelings after their infant's wearing hearing aids Case 1: Impairment detected through screening

## 6-months after giving assistance

- Understanding viewpoint of observing weak response or changes in phonation of their infant.
- Finding it important to communicate with their infant after putting hearing aids on him/her.

Parental feelings after their infant's wearing hearing aids Case 2: Impairment detected at the age of 1-2

- Believing that their infant is able to speak with hearing aids on.
- Trying to speak to their infant from behind and/or to have a communication with speech language.

Parental feelings after their infant's wearing hearing aids Case 2: Impairment detected at the age of 1-2



- Feeling happy about more utterance and expressions from their infant.
- Finding it necessary to exchange messages with various means, even when their infant is wearing hearing aids.

Parental feelings after their infant's wearing hearing aids Common tendencies

- (Infants) Able to put hearing aids on for a certain period at home, but not preferring to wear it at home.
- (Parents) Feeling sad to recognize their infant with hearing impairment.
- (Parents) Feeling uncomfortable to take their infant outside with hearing aids on.

Parental feelings after their infant's wearing hearing aids Common tendencies

### 6-months after assistance

- Finding wear-effect owing to response and changes in phonation of their infant.
- Coming to be able to enjoy relating with their infant through teaching him/her the meaning o sound.
- Easing negative feelings toward hearing aids by watching other pupils in the school.

## Summary

- There are common tendencies about different feelings of parents and their concerns according to the age and the process when impairment detected.
- It is important to give assistance with looking to the whole family so that parents can have mental stability.
- More links with hospital, public health center, and developmental assistance center increase the number of regions which can lead to appropriate and early developmental education.
